

DAVID MORTON EDUCATION CENTER

Central Catholic High School opened its doors in 1950. The school building contained sixteen classrooms, a cafeteria, library and administrative offices. In 1956, the school building was expanded by the addition of a new wing to the west of the original building as well as a new Administration Wing that connected the East and West sides of the building.

Fundraising began in 2003 to raze the East and Administration Wings and plans were drawn for a new school to occupy that space. The capital campaign netted \$9.5 million and in August of 2006, the David Morton Education Center opened. The new school contains twenty-two new classrooms, student commons, cafeteria/kitchen, and library/media center. The West Wing renovation included new floors, ceilings and lighting. The old cafeteria had a complete make over and became the new Fine Arts Center and a chemistry lab.
