

Principal's Letter

Bishop McGuinness Catholic High School is celebrating its 65th anniversary this school year. Formerly Central Catholic High School, the school was the vision of Bishop Eugene McGuinness as he envisioned a growing post-war Catholic population in north Oklahoma City. Prior to the fall of 1950, St. Joseph's in downtown Oklahoma City and Bishop John Carroll on 32nd Street provided a 1st through 12th grade education for all north Oklahoma City residents. Two hundred eighty-eight students arrived on campus in September of 1950, and a new era of Catholic education in our community began.

While Bishop McGuinness turns 65 this year, the beloved mascot, Clancy, is only 60. For the first five years, Central Catholic teams were referred to as "Greenies." It wasn't until 1955 that Clancy was adopted as the official mascot.

Prior to his appointment to Oklahoma City in 1945, Bishop Eugene McGuinness was bishop of the Raleigh Diocese of North Carolina. After his death in 1957, Bishop McGuinness Catholic High School in Knoxville, North Carolina, was built in his honor. The next year, Central Catholic High School in Oklahoma City was renamed Bishop McGuinness Catholic High School.

Today, our campus looks quite different than it did in 1950. In 2006, the original school building that faced Francis Street was razed to make room for a new school building, ready to meet the growing demands of the 21st century student body. On April 17, 2006, 710 students from across the metropolitan area gathered for the first day of school in the new building. The students of today are not very different from the students who entered in 1950. Bishop McGuinness Catholic High School students are seeking their spiritual life while preparing for a life filled with an abundance of opportunities.

Leadership, service to others, scholarship, spiritual development, social interaction and achievement are the pillars of the school. Focused on the faith-filled blessings of our patron saint Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati, our students use his life as a model of what it means to be 'a person for others.' Pier Giorgio's symbolic words, 'toward the top,' stand as a constant reminder that we are all called to walk in Christ's footsteps and seek a higher good!

Since joining the Oklahoma Secondary Schools Activities Association in 1968, Bishop McGuinness Catholic High School has won 83 state championships and another eight in One Act Play, Academic Team and Speech and Debate competitions. Extra-curricular activities not only develop pride in our school, but they give each student the opportunity to grow in areas of character, leadership, commitment, teamwork, integrity and sacrifice.

For our over 9,000 graduates, a high school diploma from Central Catholic High School or Bishop McGuinness Catholic High School opens doors and provides opportunities they could have never imagined. Our school has rightfully earned the reputation of having strong academics, competitive athletics, high student involvement and leadership opportunities all enveloped in Catholic values. We are proud of our past and look forward to the challenges and opportunities that lie ahead as we look toward the next 65 years and beyond!

May Jesus Christ be praised...Forever and ever! Where are we going? Toward the Top! Blessed Pier Giorgio...Pray for us!



CURRICULUM UPDATE

All Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Oklahoma
City have, for the last five years, been addressing issues
of vertical alignment of curriculum in the K-12 system
under the guidance of the Superintendent of Catholic
Schools, Dr. Cris Carter, and the Alliance for Catholic
Education at Notre Dame. During this period, the school
has led the way in developing curriculum that is collegepreparatory across all academic domains while retaining
the values of Catholic Education. This year, Bishop
McGuinness became the first school in the Archdiocese



to move all of its curriculum development in-house as a way of streamlining an academic process that is receptive to the changing academic needs of its students and teachers. This approach to curriculum that is benchmarked to those academic standards required for university entrance, along with testing that helps identify curricular gaps and identifies student needs but remains true to the values of Catholic education, continues to serve the school's mission of "Educating the Whole Person."

CANNED FOOD DRIVE

Beginning in 1987, the Canned Food Drive has raised over 1 million pounds of food for the Greater Oklahoma City Regional Food Bank! Last year alone, Bishop McGuinness students collected enough canned food to provide 138,565 meals for hungry Oklahomans. Clifton Roberts, Food Drive and Marketing Coordinator for the Regional Food Bank of Oklahoma, describes the BMCHS Canned Food Drive saying, "Last year through the Students Against Hunger Food and Fund Drive, Bishop McGuinness Catholic High School raised enough food and funds to provide 166,278 pounds of food for chronically hungry children, seniors struggling with hunger and hardworking families. Since 1987, students have raised more than 1,073,000 pounds of food for the Regional Food Bank of Oklahoma. Their continued enthusiasm and involvement in this annual food and fund drive has helped lead the way for other students wanting to help their hungry neighbors across Oklahoma. 


IRISH TRADITION: TOWARD THE TOP

In 1995, Bishop McGuinness students chose Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati as the school patron. He was a young Italian man who served the poor and died at a young age. Pier Giorgio wrote the words "Verso l'alto" on the back of a photo of himself climbing a mountain and gazing upward. The literal translation is "toward the top" and is representative of his life — a constant striving to reach the summit of eternal life. Bishop McGuinness students repeat the phrase "toward the top" throughout the school day as a reminder to keep their direction toward God and His great plans.

We hope that memories from your time at McGuinness hold a special place in your heart. Below is a letter from a recent graduate who gave us a look into her four years here at Bishop McGuinness Catholic High School.

I don't know what I did to deserve the opportunity to call McGIVINNESS My home. I got to travel to Peru twice, share my senior witness at the senior retreat, push myself in cross country, be a leader, fight until the end of soccer games, attend kairas, and with the support of this community I just finished 26.2 miles in the OKC Memorial Marathon. Now, I leave McGivinness Stronger. with a heavy set on God, and ready to push mystelf even harder. What I learned here will last me a lifetime, and I'm forever gratter. I'm so provd to be IRISH!



STUDENT TUITION RATE HISTORY





STUDENT ENROLLMENT HISTORY



Alumni Highlight

LAUREN SMITH

Lauren Smith, a 2006 graduate of Bishop McGuinness Catholic High School, was the first of her five siblings to attend the school! Her parents met while both were in school at Catholic colleges, her mom at St. Benedict in Minnesota and her dad at St. John's in Minnesota. A great part of their relationship was their Catholic faith, which was important when they moved here in 1982 and started a family shortly after. Lauren and her four sisters attended Rosary, and then Bishop McGuinness.

Lauren remembers graduating from Rosary with a class of 21 and feeling so excited to go to a big Catholic school, meet lots of new people and experience all of the classes offered. While in high school, Lauren participated in cross country and track. She felt so comfortable walking into McGuinness already knowing around 60 other girls from the sport. During her senior year, Lauren attended the KAIROS retreat and found it to be very impactful on her life, even still today. Like most teenagers, she was navigating her way through her faith journey. She credits KAIROS with solidifying and strengthening her belief in the Catholic faith.



After high school graduation, Lauren attended OSU where she earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Math, as well as two minors in Studio Art and Art History. She was particularly interested in teaching and wanted to challenge herself. She attended Notre Dame where she earned her Master's degree in Education. While there, she remembers the first Mass she attended where the students attending were full of genuine joy as they celebrated the Eucharist.



Lauren participated in the ACE program through Notre Dame where students take classes during the summer to earn their Master's degree and teach on various sites throughout the year. She spent three years teaching geometry, algebra, trigonometry and calculus to high school students in Jacksonville, Florida. Lauren explains that this experience urged her to return to teaching at Bishop McGuinness by saying, "Not all Catholic schools are the same, and McGuinness is a special place. Our faculty and staff and the personal relationships built at McGuinness make it a special place. Where else does your principal run with you and build a personal relationship with you as a student? After three years of teaching, I was excited to return to BMCHS because I know we educate the whole person here."

Lauren currently teaches pre-calculus and STEM (science, technology, engineering and math). Her favorite subjects have always been math and science, while also being fascinated by technology. The employment sector is facing a huge crisis because STEM careers are increasing so rapidly, but high schools and colleges are not graduating STEM students at the same pace. The majority of jobs that will be available in the next 20 years have not even been invented yet.

In STEM, Lauren is working to prepare her students for the unknown; to teach them to be curious; to learn new things; to understand that failure is part of the process of exploring new ideas and techniques. So far, the 27 students in the two STEM classes have a great interest in the curriculum. They are so in love with the class and the projects they are working on that, when the bell rings, they actually complain!

As far as the future goes, Lauren has big plans for the STEM program. "As a teacher, you want to see students eager to learn. I look forward to seeing these students inspired." For the 2015-2016 school year, Lauren's STEM class will be designing 3D objects using SketchUp, and printing them from 3D printers donated by a very generous anonymous donor. The students will also write applications for their iPads, iPhones and Apple Watches, build robots and compete in robotic competitions, as well as interact with STEM professionals.

"I feel very invested in McGuinness since attending and returning to the school. I want to see McGuinness be the best it can be and hopefully contribute to that." As a school community, we are extremely blessed to have Lauren Smith as a faculty member and alumni. Stay tuned to see where Lauren takes the STEM program from here!

Alumni of the Year Richard Tuohy



All Girls Sports Complex



NEED


